Plan Focus:

Dawson County Family Connection (DCFC) has chosen **Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs (MHON)** as a framework to improve the mental wellness of Dawson County families. MHON is structured in a hierarchy, with physiological (survival) needs at the base & self-actualization needs at the top. This model was chosen based on the understanding that families must first fulfill their fundamental needs before they can focus on self-care & personal growth.

In **FY26**, DCFC will engage partners to provide & promote resources & activities that support the foundational levels of MHON, helping families achieve security, connection, & empowerment (survival tiers). Strengthening these core needs will allow families to progress toward self-fulfillment & success (self-actualization tiers). By addressing familial needs within the MHON framework, DCFC aims to reduce child abuse & neglect & build healthier, more resilient families by breaking the cycle, which typically follows this pattern:

- 1. Children are abused or neglected.
- 2. Abused children struggle to develop coping skills.
- 3. Children with poor coping skills often face mental health issues, substance abuse, & suicidal thoughts.
- 4. Adults with these issues are more likely to abuse or neglect their own children
- 5. (REPEAT)

Desired Outcome: Improved Mental Wellness

Strategy Statement: Dawson County Family Connection (DCFC) will engage partners in providing/promoting resources & activities to children & families that support the five-stage model known as "Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs" to improve their mental wellness.
